## YOUR OFFICIAL INFORMATION ACT (1982) REQUEST HBDHB REF: 0IA2022038

I refer to your Official Information Act request dated 5 April 2022 where you requested information from Hawke's Bay District Health Board (HBDHB). Your questions and HBDHB's response is provided below:

'information on the numbers of people in New Zealand who need an interpreter in order to access effective health care'.

On Tuesday 5 April you clarified that usage in the last calendar year would be sufficient.

Hawke's Bay DHB is able to provide data pertaining to supports offered across its services only. The DHB is not able to provide regional information across all health care settings – i.e. primary care (GPs, pharamcies and non-government organisations).

Hawke's Bay DHB has engaged the use of interpreting services across a variety of languages from 6 April 2021 to 6 April 2022. Within this timeframe, interpreting services sought have totalled 1545 hours and 40 minutes (1545.40 units).

The DHB is not able to advise the numbers of people who have accessed this service. Data held is based on the number of units (hours) accessed - i.e. one unit is equal to one hour of time.

The DHB is able to advise Pasifika language interpreting services were sought the most within the timeframe specified above with 1008.65 units for Samoan language, 33 units for Tongan language and four units for Tuvaluan.
